

## **INDUSTRIAL ELECTRICIAN/CONTROL TECHNICIAN**

The Pinery Water and Wastewater District is seeking an experienced Industrial Electrician/Control Technician to troubleshoot, repair and replace electrical equipment, fixtures, apparatus and wiring, including conduit at facilities throughout the District. The District is a water and wastewater service provider located in eastern Douglas County dedicated to providing “Quality Water for LIFE” to nearly 15,000 customers in the Pinery community of Parker, Colorado.

### **General job duties include, but are not limited to:**

- Troubleshoots and repairs 24 VDC – 480 VAC equipment
- Observes functionality of installed equipment and detects hazards as well as the need for adjustment(s) or replacement
- Performs preventative maintenance with accurate recordkeeping and makes recommendations for equipment replacement before failure
- Observes equipment and systems to detect hazards and provides adjustments as needed to prevent downtime
- Performs and records preventative maintenance to keep production at optimal levels
- Installs, modifies, maintains and calibrates soft starters, VFD’s, magnetic starters, and across the line starters
- Reviews new construction/remodel documents and inspects and documents electrical contractor’s work in the District
- Available to be on call; answer and act on alarms 24 hours per day
- This job has no supervisory responsibilities

### **Competencies:**

To perform the job successfully, an individual should demonstrate the following competencies:

- Analytical - Collects and researches data; uses intuition and experience to complement data
- Problem Solving - Identifies and resolves problems in a timely manner; gathers and analyzes information to maintain productivity
- Quality Management – Propose and implement means to improve and promote quality and redundancy; monitors contracted work against contract documents for quality and compliance to District and NEC standards
- Cost Consciousness – Performs work cost-effectively; looks for cost saving opportunities and conserves organizational resources
- Safety and Security - Observes District and National safety and security procedures; determines appropriate action beyond guidelines, reports potentially unsafe conditions and uses equipment and materials properly
- Organizational Support - Follows District policies and procedures and supports organizations goals and values
- Working knowledge of electrical standards and practices within water and wastewater systems
- Working knowledge of Microsoft Office products
- Ability to read, analyze, and interpret common scientific and technical journals
- Ability to effectively communicate technical information verbally to non-technical individuals
- Organize activities with District employees and/or contractors in order to complete tasks in accordance with priorities to address multiple demands and meet deadlines
- Ability to work effectively without supervision, adapt to co-workers and deal tactfully with the public

**Qualifications:**

- High School Diploma or General Education Degree (GED) with two to three years of industrial electrical experience
- Must hold valid certificates and/or licenses as shown below:
  - State of Colorado Electrical Journeyman/Master License
  - Colorado Driver's License
- Must satisfactorily pass criminal background check and drug screening prior to commencement of employment

**Work Environment:**

- Work is performed outdoors and indoors, depending on the situation
- Employees will be exposed to risks typically associated with working around water, wastewater, chemicals, electricity and other man-made hazards, to include confined space working conditions
- Full range of body movements including stooping, twisting, kneeling, bending, leaning, reaching, climbing, stretching and working in awkward positions. May stand for extended periods of time
- Vision is needed for reading, computer work, recording and interpreting information such as construction and facility plans; speech and hearing are used to communicate with other employees over the telephone, radio and/or in person

Compensation dependent upon qualifications; starting pay is targeted between \$24.23 and \$36.63 per hour. In addition, the Pinery Water and Wastewater District offers a comprehensive benefits package to include a generous retirement saving plan where full time employees are immediately eligible for a 6% employee contribution and, after one year of continuous service, a 6% employer match.
