There is a wealth of information on your Pinery Water and Wastewater website!

- 1. The **Home** tab contains general information about the District, a photo gallery, and important announcements, such as, details on the Chloramine Conversion Project.
- The About Us tab provides bios on the five members of the Board of Directors, the District's Vision Mission Values, Board Meeting Calendars, Agendas and minutes, District Awards, and News & Pinery Pipeline Newsletters.
- The My Pinery Water tab provides access to your personal account login and describes several payments options: Drop Box, Pay in Person, U.S. Mail, Auto Pay (electronic bank transfer), Online Account, and Credit/Debit Card via Phone.
- 4. The Frequently Asked Questions tab also has five sub-topic tabs: Rates, Fees & Forms; Articles & Information; Water Conservation; Water Supply; Careers. Questions, such as, "Can I visit the facilities?", or "How do I sign up for the Advanced Metering Program?" are answered in detail under this main tab.
- 5. **Rates, Fees & Forms** contains third party studies required to justify rate and fee adjustments, current year budget, and forms like *Automatic Payment Authorization* and *Application for New Landscaping*.
- **6. Articles & Information** section has helpful articles on a variety of water and water conservation related topics, for example, *How to Read Your Bill, Chloramine Conversion FAQ*, and *Saving Water Outdoors*.
- 7. Water Conservation contains embedded videos and tips to help conserve water in Colorado's semi-arid climate, such as, "Installing Rotary Sprinkler Nozzles" and "Where and How You Wash Your Car Matters."
- 8. **Water Supply** tab explains from what sources and how the District obtains the water we have for our daily use.



CHANGES IN WATER DISINFECTION

The Pinery Water District will convert its water disinfection system to chloramines the last week of this month. This conversion is necessitated by the District's participation in the Water, Infrastructure and Supply Efficiency (WISE) regional partnership that provides the District new renewable water sources from unused water supplies from Denver and Aurora. This project will insure a perpetual renewable water supply for our customers.

Just as now, the District's chloraminated drinking water will be perfectly safe for drinking, cooking, bathing, and all other daily

water uses. There are a few uses, such as for fish aquariums or in-home kidney dialysis that require the removal of any and all types of chlorine, including chloramines. Those who use water for these types of zero-chlorine-tolerance uses should review their chlorine removal treatments to ensure that those treatments are effective in removing chloramines.

Water Main Flushing

As an essential part of our system's maintenance program, the District will begin flushing water mains through the Pinery. The District opens hydrants and blow-off valves each spring in an effort to clear our water mains of sediment and mineral buildup. This practice not only extends the life of our water mains but improves the water quality. It also offers us the opportunity to test our hydrants so that we know they are operating properly.



To cleanse the system, we systematically open

hydrants or blow-off valves to increase flows in the water mains, allowing us to "flush" minerals and deposits from the pipes. Though flushing will not interrupt your water service, when crews are working in your area, you may notice a temporary drop in water pressure or discolored water. This is normal. After flushing in your area, you may need to run cold water briefly until the water runs clear, drawing out any mineral deposits from your service line.
